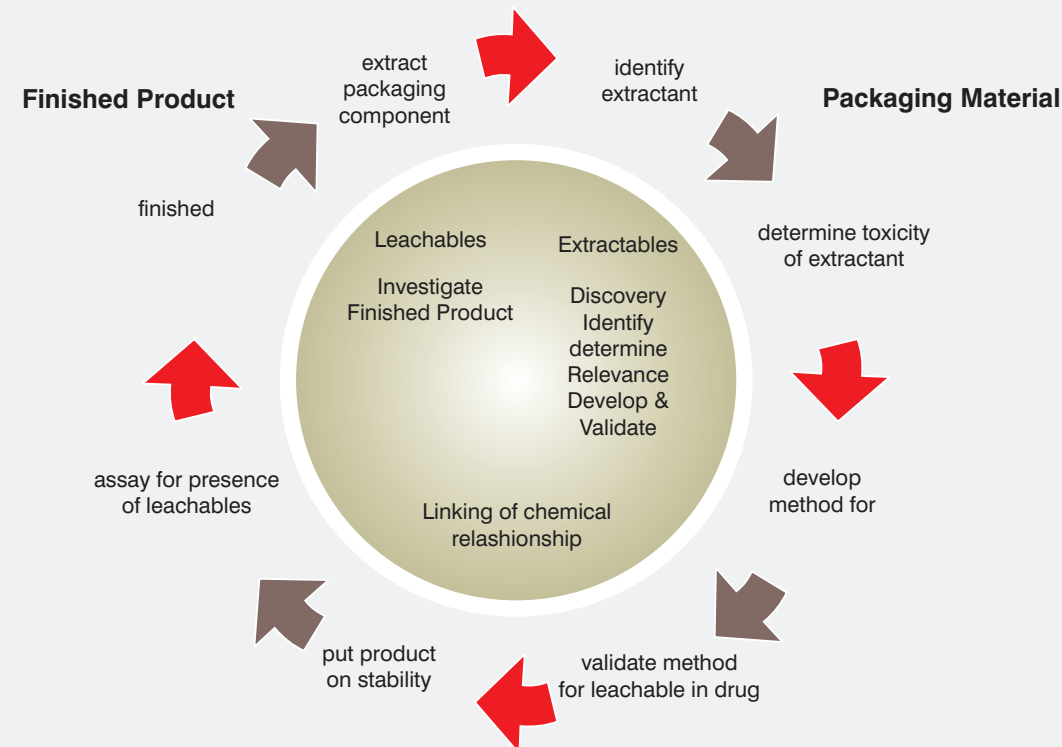

Container and container closure systems play a vital role in delivering safe and effective medicines to the consumer. A good container closure will protect the drug from deterioration by light, water and microbes.

In some cases, it will not only contain the drug, but it will also double as a device and actively deliver the drug transdermally, parenterally, or via inhalation. But, one thing a container closure system should never do is contribute ingredients that make the drug less safe. In the other hand, these products should meet the pharmaceutical safety requirements. In that context, studies of extractable and leachable components are of paramount importance.

The manufacturer of a finished product must have sufficient knowledge about the system's leachables. The Seminar will address the issues of complete extractable / leachable assessment.
