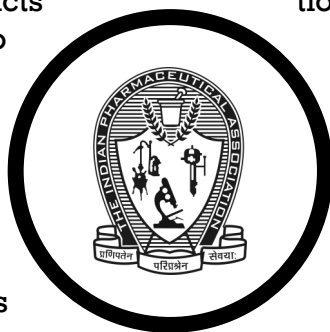

## Overview

With the increasing number of pharmaceutical products in the market, access to essential medicines is still lacking in many parts of India. Rising health care costs and changing social, technological, economic and political environments have made health care reforms necessary throughout the world. New approaches
